PRESENTATIONS

* POP Star Awards - Residential and Commercial

Lyzabeth Fiore, City Horticulturist and liaison to the Beautification Advisory Board and Ralph Caraglia, Beautification Advisory Board member, provided the presentation and presented the POP awards to the Guberman residence; Bluegreen Cafe Yard and G-21 Fitness Center.

* Student of the Quarter/Character Counts Awards

Christopher Casale, Acting Director of Parks and Leisure Services, presented the awards.

* Presentation by the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) on the Station Area Master Planning for the Potential Future Coastal Link Station in Oakland Park.

Jennifer Frasti, ECD Director introduced Mr. Dana Little, Urban Design Director of the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council, who provided the presentation.

Mr. Little stated this is a multi-agency process, we have a grant from the Federal Transit Administration and working with our partners at the South Florida Regional Planning Council as well as SFRTA Tri-rail, as well as the City and Staff. The project objective is to develop a station area concept plan for future Tri-Rail Coastal link service that is consistent with the City's Vision for Future Growth and Development. Considering the City's vision and reviewing other conditions, the recommended platform or station location would be immediately east of Jaco Pastorius Park. Mr. Little presented conceptual designs for the platform and reviewed Public Market Assessment suggesting the market should be in the range of 20,000 SF to 25,000 SF.

There were seven different cities that were involved in the grant application. Tri-Rail will be submitting the plans to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for consideration of funding as a system. Mr. Little explained the difference between a platform and a station. He stated the station area included future redevelopment and improvements that occurred around platforms. He noted the city was creating a transit oriented environment. He further explained different cities involve the public in the planning process differently. He stated the RTA would like a resolution from every city to demonstrate commitment to the overall concept of regional rail transit.
