



OCTOBER 30th: Facilities Community Meeting: On October 30, 2019 at 6:30 pm, the City will be hosting the next Community Meeting to discuss the Facilities Design Guidelines, as well as, seek input on the future of the City Park area. The meeting will be at the Collins Community Center, located at 3900 NE 3rd Ave, Oakland Park, FL 33334. Zyscovich Architects will be taking your ideas and input to

create a Master Plan of the Collins area, which will include the replacement of the Collins Community Center, Ethel M. Gordon Library, Fire Station 9, the relocation of Fire Administration, and other elements. On August 7, 2019, the City Commission moved forward with plans for the Collins Community Center area as the site for the new Ethel M. Gordon Library. The Public Works facilities near the Collins Community Center will be relocated elsewhere in the City, providing an opportunity for the area to redesigned to meet the long-term needs of the community.

Oakland Park Square: Site Remediation for Oakland Park Square has commenced. Negotiations for the Lease Agreement are underway, and the Developer is preparing for filing the site plan application.





Did you know our CRA has a nationally recognized building listed on the National Register of Historic Places? In 1988, Oakland Park Elementary School received the designation of Historic Places. The original classroom building, auditorium building, gazebo, some connecting walkways, and the main gate are designated as historic and are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. These buildings were constructed in the late 1920s. As Mediterranean Revival style structures, their exterior walls are finished in stucco and the roofing material consists of red cement barrel tiling. The School is undergoing renovations and upgrades and will be appearing before the City's Historic

Preservation Board.

New and Upcoming Development Projects

Several new businesses and projects are looking to come to the downtown.

On October 17th at 6:30 pm. **Design Moves** will be hosting a Neighborhood Participation Meeting at City Hall. They are proposing to open a wine bar at their current location of 3520 NE 12th Avenue. Immediately following that meeting at 7:00 p.m., 8009 Equities

will host their Neighborhood Participation Meeting. They are proposing to build a mixeduse building with residential and live work units on the property located on Dixie Highway and 33rd Street.

DDB Investments has filed its Development Review Application for property immediately located south of City Hall at 3560-3554 N.E. 12 has Avenue. This project is featuring a new bar restaurant called the "Butcher Barrel" which will consist of a market with fresh meats and vegetables and other gourmet products, as well as, a restaurant that serves the steaks, chops and other fresh items from the market. The bar will serve beer and wine. The project will feature a complete interior renovation of the building, as well as, exterior patio improvements for outdoor seating and new landscaping.
