**WHEREAS**, as a result of that attack almost 3,000 innocent victims lost their lives, including first responders such as firefighters, pilots, flight attendants, police, and military personnel; and

**WHEREAS**, the events of that day instantly transformed American life, through personal loss, and an unfamiliar sense of individual and national vulnerability; and

**WHEREAS**, we remember all who were killed and we honor the service and sacrifice of the brave first responders who ran toward danger to save others; and

**WHEREAS**, September 11, 2021 will be the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of this tragic event, the City of Oakland Park affirms the hope, resilience, and unity displayed in the aftermath of the attack. We will never forget.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the City Commission of the City of Oakland Park, Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in it by the Charter, does hereby authorize Mayor Jane Bolin to proclaim the 11<sup>th</sup> day of September 2021 as

**DAY OF REMEMBRANCE**

in the City of Oakland Park as we honor and support the victims, survivors, first responders and their families within our community.
