21	WHEREAS, The City of Oakland Park needs to consolidate its fee schedule for
22	the benefit of applicants and to facilitate adjustments necessary from time to time to reflect
23	current City costs; and
24	WHEREAS, Some current fees for various applications for project approvals are
25	specifically embedded in sections of the Code of Ordinances while others are found in fee
26	schedules adopted by Resolution such that these different locations make fees difficult to
27	find and update; and
28	WHEREAS, the City Commission finds it to be in the best interest of the residents
29	and property owners of the City to update the Code of Ordinances with the amended text
30	herein.
24	NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION

37	SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE L - IN GENERAL SECTIONS 7-4 7-9 & 7-11: ARTICLE

- 1 II. LICENSES, SECTIONS 7-22 & 7-27; ARTICLE III. FIRE AND GOING-OUT-OF-
- 2 BUSINESS SALES, DIVISION 2. PERMIT, SECTION 7-55; ARTICLE VI. COIN-
- 3 OPERATED DEVICES, SECTION 7-107; ARTICLE VII. SECONDHAND DEALERS,
- 4 SECTION 7-115; ARTICLE IX. PSYCHIC CONSULTING, SECTION 7-122; AND
- 5 ARTICLE X. SEXUALLY ORIENTED BUSINESSES, SECTION 7-135 are hereby
- 6 amended as follows:

ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

- Sec. 7-4. Permit to engage in refuse collection business, supplying a compactor, roll-off or cardboard recycling container.
- 12 (f) Solid waste services. Upon providing the necessary information, applicants shall be entitled to a permit for a period of one (1) year, provided:
 - (1) The applicant shall pay the city an annual fee <u>established by Resolution adopted</u> <u>by City Commission of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00)</u> for compactor container service or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) for roll-off container service. All monies collected shall be transferred to the solid waste budget.
 - (2) In addition to the above annual fee, permitted private solid waste contractors shall be charged a monthly usage fee <u>established by Resolution adopted by City Commission of one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per cubic yard of the total collection capacity of all accounts, serviced by them within the city exclusive of materials that will be recycled and are collected in designated cardboard recycling containers.</u>
 - (3) Permitted private collector usage fees due the city will be calculated by the permitted private collector in the manner prescribed by the finance department and be based upon the total monthly collection capacity in cubic yards of all accounts serviced by them in the city and the current usage fee rates per cubic yard of collection capacity. Usage fees are due and payable to the city by the twentieth of the previous month within which the collection and/or services were provided.
 - (4) Permitted private collectors who do not pay usage fees when due will be assessed a penalty of one (1) percent per month calculated daily on the unpaid balance of all fees due. The date of arrival at the city will be used to determine the amount of penalty levied. Billings for penalties shall be calculated and billed monthly and are due and payable upon receipt.
 - (g) Recycling of cardboard materials. Upon providing the necessary information, including but not limited to monthly weight reports, collectors shall be entitled to a

permit for a period of one (1) year to bundle, bale, store and transport recyclable cardboard materials. The applicant shall pay the city an annual permit fee <u>established</u>

by Resolution adopted by City Commission of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). All monies collected shall be transferred to the solid waste budget.

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- Sec. 7-9. Special events.
- (b) Submittal of application.
 - (1) A complete application shall be submitted no later than thirty (30) days prior to the commencement of an event along with a non-refundable application fee established by Resolution adopted by City Commission based on the following schedule:
 - a. Submitted more than sixty (60) days before the event\$250.00
- b. Submitted between forty-five (45) and fifty nine (59) days before the event\$350.00
 - c. Submitted between forty-four (44) and thirty (30) days before the event\$450.00

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- Sec. 7-11. Fee assessment on telecommunications companies that occupy municipal rights-of-way for telecommunications facilities.
- 20 (b) Fee for telecommunications company occupation of rights-of-way.
 - (1) In the event that a telecommunications company which provides telecommunications services defined as toll services in section 203.012(7), Statutes (2000), occupies the city's rights-of-way, the telecommunications company shall pay to the city annually an amount established by Resolution adopted by City Commission five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per linear mile, which amount is prorated for any portion thereof, for any cable, fiber optic, or other pathway that makes physical use of the city's rights-of-way. Such annual fee shall be prorated to reflect the expiration date of this section and shall be payable annually, in advance. If a telecommunications company that is required to pay a fee pursuant to this subsection (b)(1)b. increases the amount of its facilities occupying the city's rights-of-way after such advance payment has been made, but prior to the expiration date of this section, the fees due for the additional facilities shall be prorated and paid in full at the time the facilities are installed in the city's rights-of-way.

The fee or other consideration imposed pursuant to this subsection (b)(1)b. shall not apply in any manner to any telecommunications company which provides local telephone service as defined in section 203.012(3), Florida

- 3 (a) Any business license may be transferred to a new owner, when there is a bona fide 4 sale of the business, upon payment of a transfer fee <u>established by Resolution adopted</u> 5 <u>by City Commission of ten (10) percent of the annual license tax, but not less than</u> 6 three dollars (\$3.00) nor more than twenty five dollars (\$25.00), and presentation of 7 the original license and evidence of the sale.

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ARTICLE VI. - COIN-OPERATED DEVICES

- Sec. 7-107. General provisions to which machines subject.
- Any and all machines licensed under this article shall be subject to the following provisions:
 - (5) Occupational license certificates which may be issued by the city for such machines, shall at all times be posted and/or attached to such machines and prominently displayed thereon. Such licenses shall designate the location for which such machines shall be operated, and there shall appear upon said license, the number of the license and the manufacturer's serial number of the machine. Any machine which shall be removed for operation to another location in the city shall not be permitted to be operated or played unless and until the license certificate shall have been presented to the finance director and a new certificate shall have been issued for such new location, and a fee established by Resolution

adopted by City Commission of one dollar (\$1.00) shall be paid to said finance director for the issuance of such certificate; this provision shall also apply to any machine or machines which may be taken out by the operator for repairs or other purposes and another machine of the same exact type and classification left in place of the machine removed.

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ARTICLE VII. - SECONDHAND DEALERS

 - Information required. Every applicant for a license to engage in the business of a secondhand dealer shall file with the code enforcement officer of the City of Oakland Park a written application upon a form prepared and provided by the city, signed by the applicant. An application fee established by Resolution adopted by City Commission the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) is required. If approved, the application fee will be applied to the license fee. If the application is disapproved, such fee shall be retained as and for the cost of investigating the applicant and the statements contained in the application. Every application of a license to engage in the business of a secondhand dealer shall be signed and acknowledged before a notary public or other officer authorized to administer oaths. - No occupational license to engage in the occupation of psychic consulting or other 23 24 practice or profession as described herein shall be issued to any person unless such person first holds a valid permit issued by the city's police department. Application for 25 said permit shall be on a form supplied by the police department. The applicant shall 26 furnish all the information required by the form and shall also meet the following conditions: 28
 - The application shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable fee established by (5) Resolution adopted by City Commission of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to cover the reasonable cost of processing the permit.

The initial license and annual renewal fees for sexually oriented business licenses shall be as <u>established by Resolution adopted by City Commission</u> follows: one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the initial fee for a sexually oriented business license and fifty dollars (\$50.00) for annual renewal.

SECTION 3. If any clause, section or other part of this Ordinance shall be held by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutional or invalid part shall be considered as eliminated and in no way affecting the validity of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflicts.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> It is the intention of the City Commission of the City of Oakland Park, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Oakland Park, Florida, and the Sections of this ordinance may be renumbered, re-lettered and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section," "Article," or such other word or phrase in order to accomplish such intention.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and adoption by the City Commission of the City of Oakland Park.
