

1 **Sec. 12-19. Program for Public Information Board.**

2 (A) Established. There is hereby established a Program for Public Information
3 (PPI) Board tasked with providing input and recommendations for suggested
4 outreach as part of the City's Community Rating System (CRS) flood prevention
5 and awareness efforts. The purpose of the PPI is to provide input and
6 recommendations to the City Commission for suggested outreach as part of the
7 process.

8
9 (B) Membership; The Board shall consist of five members and be appointed for a
10 two-year term as follows:

11
12 (1) Two (2) members shall be either a City resident or business owner and
13 shall be appointed by the City Commission.

14
15 (2) One (1) member shall be a City resident or business owner with
16 insurance industry credentials and shall be appointed by the City
17 Commission.

18
19 (3) One (1) member will be the City's designated Floodplain Manager; and

20
21 (4) One (1) member will be the City's Public Information Officer.

22
23 (C) Procedures.

24
25 (1) The presence of three (3) or more members shall constitute a quorum.

26
27 (2) The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order
28 Newly Revised shall govern the Board in all cases to which they are
29 applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with any special rules of
30 order the Board may adopt.

31
32 (D) Duties and responsibilities.

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34 (1) The Program for Public Information Board shall act in an advisory
35 capacity to provide recommendations to the City Commission for
36 suggested outreach as part of the Program for Public Information process.

1 (2) The Program for Public Information Board shall operate in accordance
2 with Community Rating System (CRS) guidelines.

3
4 (3) The Program for Public Information Board shall meet at least twice in
5 its first year and meet at least once annually after that:

6 (a) to review the assessment and

7 (b) to review the Program for Public Information document before
8 sending it to the City Commission.

9
10 **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this
11 Ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected by such
12 invalidity.

13
14 **SECTION 4.** That all ordinances or parts of ordinances and all resolutions or
15 parts of resolutions in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such
16 conflict.

17
18 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the City Commission of the City of Oakland
19 Park, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code
20 of Ordinances of the City of Oakland Park, Florida, and the Sections of this ordinance
21 may be renumbered, re-lettered and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section,"
22 "Article," or such other word or phrase in order to accomplish such intention.

23
24 **SECTION 6.** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage
25 and adoption by the City Commission of the City of Oakland Park.
