Re: Trulieve Medical Marijuana Dispensary Neighborhood Participation Meeting Summary

The City of Oakland Park provided the contact information for nearby homeowner associations, including the Harlem McBride Neighborhood Association, Lloyd Estates Neighborhood Association, River Core Neighborhood Association, and Colonial Park HOA. We confirmed the meeting date with the City on June 10, 2021 and notice of the meeting was provided via email and phone call twice. Once on June 15, 2021 and again on June 29, 2021.

Additionally we requested a list of homeowners that would be contacted by the city during the notice process. We attempted to locate phone numbers and/or emails for that list and called through to as many homeowners as we could find.

Attached you will the Neighborhood Meeting Program Affadavit of Compliance, screenshots from the zoom meeting in lieu of the Sign-In Sheet identifying all of the attendees, and a copy of our presentation shared in the meeting.

The meeting was held on June 30, 2021 at 6:30PM via zoom. The meeting began with introductions of the Trulieve Team and was followed by a PowerPoint presentation by lobbyist Stephanie Grutman Zauder of Ballard Partners. The presentation included information on the law, the company, and the project. Some questions were asked related to:

Employees:

How many employees do you have and how much are they paid?:

Dispensaries have roughly 20-22 employees. They are required to be 21+ with full back ground check. Employees are hired locally and range in pay from hourly to salaried.

Traffic:

Do you expect excessive traffic?

A traffic study was conducted and available on request.

Security:

The neighborhood had significant security issues due to the motel across the street. Will this project make the community more unsafe?

Trulieve has a full time security guard on site at all times during business hours and full coverage, live monitored video cameras 24/7. Unfortunately, the motel across the street is not in the city of Oakland Park. Trulieve security will be able to monitor and report any activity to both Wilton Manors and Oakland Park Law Enforcement.

2014 Law Provides Hope for Florida's Sick Children

- In 2014 at the urging of Florida parents Governor Rick Scott signed into law the "Compassionate Medical Cannabis Act of 2014" to legalize low-THC strain of marijuana providing life changing relief for sick children.
- Led by the parents of RayAnn Moseley an 11yr old girl from Pensacola with epilepsy and cerebral palsy and Rebecca Hyman a 9yr old girl from Broward who suffers from a severe genetic disorder with daily seizures.
- Law only allowed limited low-THC cannabis products to be prescribed by licensed physicians for patients suffering from cancer, epilepsy, chronic seizures or muscle spasms.
- Authorized Florida's Department of Health to register patients and doctors and to approve five Florida based nurseries with 30 years of experience to grow, produce and distribute the medicine.

2016 Florida Voters Approve Constitutional Amendment #2

- 71% of Florida Voters Approved the Florida Medical Marijuana Legalization Initiative (Amendment 2)
- Amendment 2 made the use of medical marijuana legal <u>only</u> for qualified patients with specific medical conditions.
- Amendment 2 required that only licensed physicians can prescribe the use of Medical Marijuana.
- Amendment 2 Establishes Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers (MMTCs)

Amendment 2 Implementation and MMTCs

- In June 2017 the Legislature held a special session to implement the constitutional amendment by passing the Medical Use of Marijuana Act and created the Office of Medical Marijuana Use at Dept of Health to implement these rules.
- Patients must be a Florida resident, diagnosed by a licensed physician, and apply for a medical marijuana use card.
- Patients must have one of the following conditions with ALS, Cancer, Crohns, Epilepsy, Glaucoma, HIV/AIDs, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's, PTSD, Parkinsons, Terminal Illnesses or chronic non-malignant pain.
- Patients can only purchase their medicine at a certified Medical Marijuana
 Treatment Center.







State Mandated and Monitored Security Features

- Full time security guards onsite during operational hours and 24/7 monitoring of all internal and external cameras.
- Fully integrated electronic access control system on all doors will limit all access to the facility from the outside and interior doors.
- Security station at main entrance vestibule to screen and audit anyone entering the facility; age verification for all patients with 50state fraud detection scanner.
- Second ID check by trained staff at Point of Sale.
- Access to dispensary floor by uniformed security following ID check.
- Site Security Video Surveillance with roughly one camera for every 100 square feet providing interior and exterior protection
- State of the full-coverage burglar alarm with Intrusion and holdup/panic/duress
- Full-coverage fire alarm (meets FL fire code) and Restricted access (electronic locks on doors)




- Child resistant and tamper-proof packaging, with multiple warning labels
- All Employees are licensed by state, following background checks
- No cannabis use on premises
- Entire lot camera coverage
- No marketing, advertising, or branding practices that are targeted to, deemed to appeal to, or portray minors under 21 years of age
- No sale of any product resembling a realistic or fictional human, animal, or fruit, including artistic, caricature, or cartoon renderings
- No employees under the age of 21, or have been convicted of distribution of controlled substances to minors
- No marijuana-related designs or logos will appear on the exterior, interior or any merchandise
- Although all products are pre-sealed, any odors are eliminated through filtration, including air scrubbers to eliminate airborne pathogens in the building and filter air leaving the building
- Patients under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or caregiver
