Stormwater Fees

Dear Mr. Herbert:

The issue of whether school districts are required to pay Storm Water Fees to municipalities has been a topic before the Courts in Florida since 2001. The First, Second and Third District Courts of Appeal have all held that although a stormwater fee may be a valid utility fee, school districts are entitled to Sovereign Immunity. Therefore before a city can sue to collect the fee, it must have a written contract. ¹ Additionally, currently pending in this jurisdiction, the Fourth DCA, is <u>City of West Palm Beach v. The School Board of Palm Beach County</u>, Case No. 4D18-0183, L.T. Case No. 502013CA010144XXXXMB-AH, an appeal by the City of a ruling from the Circuit Court of Palm Beach County, which provides that the cases named in footnote number 1 below were both controlling and persuasive.

This letter is to provide notice to your City that as of October 1, 2018, Broward County School District is exercising its right under Sovereign Immunity and will no longer pay stormwater utility fees. This decision was made by considering the legal precedents the above named cases afford the School District and acknowledging that the School District and the City of Oakland Park do not have a written contract regarding Stormwater Fees.

Please feel free to have your City Attorney contact the School Board's General Counsel should they want to discuss this issue further.
