WHEREAS, the Oakland Park neighborhood of Prospect Gardens is celebrating its 76th Anniversary; and

WHEREAS, in July 1946 brothers Rocco and Nicholas Faillace moved from New York to a half square mile property in unincorporated Broward County purchased by the Rocco and Huh families; and

WHEREAS, in September 1946 the property was surveyed and entered into the county record as Prospect Gardens subdivision; and

WHEREAS, several long time businesses such as Catfish Dewey's, Hanna Paint & Hardware, Pinho's Bakery & Deli, Ottographics, Pride and Joy Learning Center, and Vintage Diversity border the neighborhood which is comprised of a handful of longtime residents and many young families.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Commission of the City of Oakland Park, Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in it by the Charter, does hereby authorize Mayor Michael E. Carn to proclaim the 7th day of September 2022 as
